

## Rules and laws of...

### Selling

	Gambling manual
Volunteers, lessors, lessor's immediate family and employees are prohibited from playing pull-tabs, tipboards, paddlewheels and Bingo. Some exceptions, see manual.  <b>In addition;</b> this restriction is in effect until <b>two weeks</b> after the employee or volunteer is no longer involved in the conduct of pull-tabs, tipboards, and paddlewheels at that premises. Pull-tab sellers may not provide any "insider" information to players, e.g., "good or bad boxes".  Pull-tab sellers may not help a player open pull-tab tickets.  Pull-tab sellers may not "hold" or "freeze" a pull-tab game for players.	Chapter 4 page 34
Cash only.  Credit may not be extended to a player.  Checks, credit cards, or debit cards may not be accepted.	Chapter 4 page 34

### Redeeming winning tickets

<b>Before paying the player...</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Check the ticket serial number.</li><li>• Do not accept tickets that are damaged, marked or have left the premises.</li><li>• Deface winning ticket using a bingo dauber, drawing across the ticket with a marker or pen (no pencils) or punching a hole. <b>Tearing a pull-tab ticket is not considered defacing and is not allowed.</b></li><li>• Remove the ticket(s) from the player's reach.</li><li>• Cross off the appropriate amount from the flare (when applied).</li><li>• Complete the prize receipt. Be sure <b>both</b> you and the player sign the receipt.</li><li>• Staple the receipt to the ticket (one staple please). Do not fold the receipt...</li></ul>	Chapter 4
